The Women's Resource Center of Hancock County is a nonprofit organization providing free and confidential services to women and families in need.

The center provides a safe place for women, fathers and families to obtain support and services in the event of unintended pregnancies or other family hardships, equipping and empowering them to choose life. The center provides pregnancy testing, ultrasounds, mentoring, parenting classes, Bible studies and support, as well as material needs including diapers, formula and other items essential to the health and safety of the children in need.

WRC also partners with Hancock County Job & Family Services to provide court-mandated parenting classes and supervised family visitation through Child Protective Services (CPS). Our facility and approach is unique in Hancock County and provides families with one-on-one education and mentoring. We have experienced an increased demand for services and as a team wanted to meet these needs by allowing for growth both in our services and facility space.

WRC chose to transition to providing medical services, as well as acquire a new space that will be dedicated to growing our partnership with CPS.

Our goal is to continue to remain true to our mission, enabling the staff to promote and protect the sanctity of all human life while encouraging people to choose life and make healthy, life-affirming decisions. The expansion and growth of our services meets the increased needs of our community through the team at WRC by passionately providing resources and education to families for hope-filled, abundant futures.

GOALS

To make our services available to more families and to expand our programming, we are setting a \$3 million fundraising goal. These funds will be used in the following areas:

Building Expenses & New Initiatives

Converting our main office building into a pregnancy medical center was our first initiative. While still offering parenting classes, mentoring and Bible studies, our new pregnancy medical clinic has allowed us to begin offering free limited obstetric ultrasounds along with pregnancy testing. Our campaign goal includes costs incurred buying and renovating the adjacent house for programmatic expansion. The added space in the house has given us the opportunity to provide supervised visitation for families in foster care, as well as providing one-on-one mentoring to men and women who are working on family reunification. Our hope is to continue growing our services to include a fatherhood program and post-abortive recovery support.


Foundational Support
